1.0 COMMON FEATURES

1.1 Qualification for Admission:

1. Ayurvedacharya Degree (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery) of University of Rajasthan Jaipur OR any equivalent examination recognized by the Rajasthan Ayurveda University, Jodhpur and Gujrat Ayurved University, Jamnagar or Degree of any other University found equivalent by these Universities.

Note: The Institute will not be responsible for non-inclusion of any qualification in the above said Universities equivalent list.

2. The candidates must have completed the Six or Twelve months rotating Internship/House Job, as the case may be, after passing the qualifying examination, as stipulated by C.C.I.M., by **16th July 2010.**
3. Candidates already studying in MD/MS(Ay.) Part-I in the above Institutes may appear in the Test, if they desire so, only after depositing back the entire Stipend received by them to the respective Institutes.
4. The Application Form and Prospectus with details can be downloaded from the Websites of either Institutes from **17.04. 2010** onwards and the following is the schedule of dates for downloading the Prospectus and Application Form and submitting the same in the host Institute i.e. National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur.

2. JOINT POST-GRADUATE ENTRANCE TEST (JPGET-2010)

The Post-Graduate Entrance Test is conducted for Admission to Ayurveda Vachaspati/Dhanvantari (MD/MS (Ayurveda) Part-I in the Institute after inviting Application on all-India basis. The Entrance Test will be held simultaneously at Jaipur and Jamnagar on Sunday **04-7-2010** from **9.00AM to 10.30AM**. The candidates must specify their choice of Centre in the form.

2.1. Selection of Candidates for Admission

Selection of the candidates for Admission shall be made by a Selection Committee constituted by competent Authority. Selection of the candidates shall be made strictly on the basis of Final Merit Index calculated out of the Total Index of 100 Marks based on Written Test and Marks obtained in the subject concerned and the Marks obtained in the Final Year Examination of the Degree Course in the following manner :

Marks obtained in the Written Test of 80 Marks Plus the Index of Marks obtained in the Subject concerned (to be calculated out of 10 Marks) Plus the Index of Marks obtained in the Final Year Examination of the Degree Course (to be calculated out of 10

Marks). The Written Test of 80 Marks shall consist of one common written paper comprising Objective Type Questions set from the standard texts and reference books covering the subjects of Ayurvedacharya (BAMS) Course.

2.2 Reservations, Subjects and Admission Capacity

- i. Subjects, Reservations and Admission Capacity are different in the three Institutes. The distribution of seats in a particular institute will be as per the rules and regulations of the respected Institute. For actual availability of seats in N.I.A. Jaipur, IPGTR&A, Jamnagar, and GAAC, Ahmedabad please see the relevant portions of prospectus of National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur (www.nia.nic.in) and Gurjarat Ayurveda University, Jamanagar (www.ayurvedauniversity.com).

2.3 Reservations, Subjects and Admission Capacity

Reservations, Subjects and Admission Capacity in NIA, Jaipur

50% Seats are Reserved for the Candidates of Rajasthan Ayurved University / University of Rajasthan and 50% for Other University Candidates in all the subjects (Except central govt. Nominees and BIMSTEC Nominees) as per the table No 1 & 2. However, the Constitutional reservations of SC,ST,OBC,& PH Categories Precede the University reservation and in case of Seats remaining vacant in a Particular Category due to lack of sufficient no. of qualified Candidates of the same category and same university group then these seats will be filled from the same category from the other University group.

- a. Seats Reserved under Central Pool for States / UTs where no PG facility is available in the Subject concerned; 1 Seat among the Seats in each Subject is reserved under Central Pool. Such candidates are advised to send the Application (Format of Application is given at Annexure-I & II) through their respective Government to the Department of AYUSH, Red Cross Building, Red Cross Road, New Delhi 110001, India for consideration because these seats will be filled only after getting direction from the Department of AYUSH. The admission will be limited, subject to other provisions of University / CCIM etc.
- b. 3 seats are reserved for Candidates from BIMSTEC Countries. i.e. Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Thailand and which includes 1 seat for Sri Lankan Candidate. The applications (in Annexure-II) duly forwarded by the respective Govt./Agency and nominated by the Indian Council of Cultural Relations, Ministry of External Affairs, Azad Bhavan, Indraprastha Estate, New Delhi must reach the Institute latest by **15.07.2010**. There shall be no Entrance Test for such candidates.

- c.** 25% of the Seats, after excluding the Central Pool Nominee Seats and BIMSTEC Nominee seats, as mentioned in 2.3 a.& b above, shall be reserved for In-service Candidates employed in Central / State Government / UT and out of which 15% seats are for natural born SC Candidate and 7.5% for natural born ST Candidates. 27% Seats are reserved for those OBC candidates who do not belong to Creamy layer. The seats of respective categories and university groups remaining vacant will be filled by the same category and the other university group. If no appropriately qualified in-service candidate is available the vacant seats will be carried to the general pool taking care that the reservations of the category and university groups remain intact.
- d.** 15% of seats, after deducting the Central Pool Nominee Seats and In-Service Candidates of Central / State Government / UT as mentioned in clause a,b, & c above, are reserved for natural born Scheduled Caste Candidates and 7.5% for natural born Scheduled Tribe Candidates . These Seats shall be filled from the Candidates belonging to the relevant SC/ST Category on the basis of Merit, subject to the condition that 50% of these seats shall be filled in by Candidates passing the Ayurvedacharya/ BAMS Examination from the Rajasthan University/Rajasthan Ayurveda University Jodhpur. If a single seat is left after equal distribution of the seats among the UOR/RAU Degree holders and other than UOR/RAU Degree holders (i.e. 50% each) it will be filled by the next candidate standing in the respective SC/ST Merit Lists.
- e.** 27% Seats after deducting the Central Pool Nominee, BIMSTEC Seats and In-Service Candidates of Central/State Government /UT as mentioned in clause a, b & c above are reserved for those OBC candidates who do not belong to Creamy layer. These seats shall be filled from the Candidates belonging to the relevant OBC Category on the basis of Merit, subject to the condition that 50% of these seats shall be filled in by Candidates passing the Ayurvedacharya/BAMS Examination from the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur and /or Rajasthan Ayurved University , Jodhpur. If a single seat is left after equal distribution of the seats among the UOR/RAU Degree holders and other than UOR/RAU Degree holders (i.e. 50% each) , it will be filled by the next candidate standing in the respective OBC Merit List.
- f.** 3% of the Seats, after deducting the Seats mentioned in Clauses a, b,c,d & e above are reserved for Physically Handicapped Candidates (50-70% handicap). These seats shall be filled from the Candidates belonging to the relevant PH Category on the basis of Merit, subject to the condition that 50% of these seats shall be filled in by Candidates passing the Ayurvedacharya/BAMS Examination from the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur and /or Rajasthan Ayurved University, Jodhpur. If a Single seat is left after equal distribution of the seats among the UOR/RAU Degree holders and other than UOR/RAU Degree holders (i.e. 50% each) , it will be

filled by the next candidate standing in the respective PH Merit List.

- g.** The remaining seats, which shall be called as General Seats and the unfilled seats from those reserved under Clause 2.3 a, b, c, d e & f above and after exhausting the Common Merit List in each category and university groups, shall be filled from the Candidates belonging to General Category on the basis of Merit, subject to the condition that 50% of these seats shall be filled in by Candidates passing the Ayurvedacharya / BAMS Examination from the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur / or Rajasthan Ayurved University, Jodhpur. If a single seat is left after equal distribution of the seats among the UOR/RAU Degree holders and other than UOR/RAU Degree holders (i.e. 50% each), it will be filled by the next candidate standing in the Combined Merit list.

2.4 Admission Test

The Entrance Test will be held simultaneously at Jaipur and Jamnagar on Sunday 04.07.2010 from 9.00 AM to 10.30 AM.

2.5 Marks of Admission Test

There will be an Objective Type Written Test of 80 Marks covering the syllabus of the disciplines of graduate course as laid down by CCIM. There will be 80 Questions in the Paper and the duration of the Test will be 1½ hours (One hour and thirty minutes). The candidates have to select the best of the available answers. One mark will be given for each correct answer and ¼ mark will be deducted for each wrong answer. Overwriting or ambiguously marked answer will be treated as un-attempted. If required, proportionate Bonus Marks shall be awarded.

Grievance against question, if any, should be submitted in the Office of the Examination Centre Supdt. Of the respective institutes before 12.15 noon on the same day of the Test, i.e. **04.07.2010** after which no complaint or grievance will be entertained.

2.6 Marks of Professional Examination

The Maximum Marks shall be 20. Index of Marks obtained in the subject concerned will be calculated out of 10 Marks and the Index of Marks obtained in the Final Year Examination of the Degree Course will be calculated out of 10 Marks. Both sets of Index Marks will be added together to get the Index of Marks out of 20. Only the Minimum Pass Marks prescribed will be counted for the subjects cleared in attempt examinations.

2.7 Minimum qualifying Marks

The Minimum Eligibility Marks for consideration of Admission in the case of General Candidates shall be 50% of the Total Marks (Marks of Admission Test + Index Marks) and in the case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes shall be 40%. However, securing the Minimum Qualifying Marks does not guarantee for admission, which will be according to the Merit List and other provisions.

2.8 Character/Conduct

Candidates should bring the Character/Conduct Certificate in the prescribed form at the time of interview. Candidates whose character has not been found satisfactory during the degree course are liable to be rejected.

2.9 Application Forms

- i. Candidate must apply in the prescribed Application Form which can be downloaded from the Websites of the respective Institutes: www.nia.nic.in and www.ayurvedauniversity.com.
Application form duly filled along with attested copies of all relevant documents and a Demand Draft of Rs. 1250/- for General Candidates, other backward class and Physically handicapped and Rs. 900/- for SC/ST candidates drawn in favor of "Director, National Institute of Ayurveda Jaipur" from any Nationalised banks should be submitted in the host Institute by the Last Date of receipt of Application, i.e. **21.05.2010** till 5 PM. Forms received after this date will not be accepted or entertained in any circumstance. Application Forms will also not be accepted by FAX or E-mail.
- ii. The Candidate shall fill in the Application Form in his/her own handwriting neatly.
- iii. The Candidate is required to carefully go through the Prospectus before filling the Application Form.
- iv. The Candidate should clearly mention the preferred examination centre.
- v. Application Form completed in all respects must reach the Director, N.I.A. Jaipur by 5 PM on or before **21.05.2010** along with all enclosures. The envelope containing the Form should be superscribed "Application For PGET 2010". Application Forms received after 5 PM on **21.05.2010** or incomplete in any respect will not be considered.
- vi. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that his/her Application Form reaches the Institute before the prescribed time and he/she fills in the correct address legibly on the self-

addressed envelope for sending the Permission Letter for the Test. The Institute shall not be responsible for any loss of Application Form in transit or loss of Permission Letter because of any incorrect address given by the candidate on the envelope. Candidates are advised to send the Application Form by speed post/registered post to ensure safe receipt by the Institute. The Permission Letter shall be sent by Registered post in the self-addressed envelope attached with Application Form.

- vii. Incomplete Application Form in any respect shall be liable for rejection and no correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- viii. The Candidates are required to appear for the Admission Test and also for Interview at respective centres at their own expenses.
- ix. In-Service Candidates of Central/State Government who seek admission against the seats reserved for the said category can submit their candidature in a Photostat copy of the original Application Form with forwarding letter and/or No Objection Certificate by the Competent Authority so as to reach the Office of the Director, National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur on or before **15.07.2010**, otherwise the Candidate will not be considered for In-service Category and instead he/she will be considered for General Category only. However, they should submit an advance copy on Prescribed Application Form along with attested copies of all the certificates up to 5 PM on **21.05.2010** to the Director, N.I.A. Jaipur.
- x. Candidates should clearly mention the Category (In-Service-General, In-Service-SC, In-Service-ST, In-Service-OBC General, SC, ST, OBC, PH) in the column provided under which he/she seeks admission.
- xi. In the absence of proof of belonging to SC, ST, OBC, PH, In-Service etc. such candidates will be treated as General Category candidates.

2.10 Declaration of Result

The Institute, after conducting the Admission Test, will evaluate the Answer Scripts and notify the Merit List. The Various merit lists according different categories will be available on the Websites. No separate mark-lists will be sent to the candidates.

2.11 Admission Procedure

- i. The candidates will be subject to the rules & regulation of the respective institutes.
- ii. The Host Institute reserves the right to correcting any inadvertent error in any Merit List and also in the Prospectus.
- iii. The Admission Committee shall interview the candidates and allot the Subjects taking into account the Scheme of distribution of Reserved seats, Merit lists of respective categories, the order of the Merit of JPGET, Preference and Availability.
- iv. The right of admission of any candidate who does not complete the prescribed Internship by **16th July 2010** will automatically stand cancelled.

- v. Vacancies arising due to non-joining within the stipulated time or due to candidates leaving the Institute shall be filled by reshuffling on the basis of Reservations and Merit-cum-Preference List. The vacancies arising after reshuffling or at a later date not exceeding 60 days from the initial admission shall be filled in from amongst the candidates in the Waiting Lists (Except Central Govt. and BIMSTEC Nominee Candidates).

2.12 Counseling, Merit List, Subject Preference and Allotment

- i. The candidates will be called for counseling according to :
 - a. Order of the Reservation categories as mentioned in clause 2.2 (i), 2.3 a, b, c,d, e ,f & g
 - b. Order of the Merit List of JPGET.
 - c. Provisional Merit Lists: Separate Provisional Merit Lists shall be prepared for each subject in accordance with Clause No. 2.1 and for each category as mentioned in 2.2 (i) a, b, c, d, e and f.
- ii. The Subjects for Central Government Nominees and Nominees of BIMSTEC Countries shall be as allotted by the Govt. of India.
- iii. For rest of the Categories, subjects shall be allotted according to Reservations, Merit in the respective Subjects, Preference, Availability etc.
- iv. In case of tie, the candidate securing higher marks in the Entrance Test shall be given preference. If a tie still exists, the allotment shall be made giving preference to seniority in age.
- v. The Actual Admissions in a particular Institute will be subject to the rules and regulations of that Institute.

2.13 Miscellaneous

- i. The preference given by the candidate with respect to institute/subject at the time of submission of Form/Counseling will be final and no change will be allowed subsequently.
- ii. The Admission Form will be considered for the MD/MS(Ay.) Part-I only for the Session and Year the candidate applies for.
- iii. The Application Form Fee/Test Fee/Revaluation/Re-totaling Fee is not refundable in any case nor is transferable to the next examination.
- iv. Admission will be granted subject to being declared Medically Fit by a duly Constituted Body by the Institute.
- v. The Director reserves the right to accept or reject any Application Form or to amend any rule and regulation or cancel any admission without assigning any reason thereof.
- vi. The original documents of the admitted candidates will remain with the Institute till completion of the Course.
- vii. Any dispute will be subject to Jaipur Jurisdiction only.
- viii. The admitted candidates have to submit their Synopsis for thesis within six months of their Admission.

GENERAL INFORMATION IN CONTEXT OF NIA

3.1 Aim of the Post-Graduate Course: The aim of the Post-Graduate course shall be to provide proper training to the students and make them competent Teachers, Research Workers and specialists in the respective subject.

3.2 Duration of the Course: The Course Study for the Post-Graduate Degree of Ayurveda Vachaspati(MD/MS(Ay.) (..... Subject concerned) is of three years duration having two Examinations as follows:

- (1) Part-I (Preliminary) Examination at the end of one academic year after admission.
- (2) Part-II (Final) Examination at the end of two academic years after completing Part-I Course.

No Candidate shall be relieved before the completion of the Course under any circumstance. If at all a scholar wishes to leave the course, he will have to refund the entire Stipend received from the Institute.

3.3 Method of Training: The Scholars admitted will be given intensive training in classical knowledge along with comparative and critical study of the subject. They are required to know about the methods and techniques of research work done in the respective fields and take part in various seminars, group discussions, clinical meetings etc. in the Institute. The Scholars are also required to participate in the teaching and training program for under-graduate students or interns in their subjects. They will also have to attend the Hospital duties assigned to them during all the three years.

3.4 Medium of Training: Sanskrit/ Hindi/English shall be the medium for the Post-Graduate Training and Thesis in Ayurveda. The Question Papers will be set in Hindi/English and the candidates can answer in Hindi or Sanskrit or English.

3.5 Stipend: The Monthly PG Stipend presently available is Rs. 15820/- in First Year, Rs. 16950/- in Second Year and Rs. 18080/- in Third Year plus DA as applicable, in accordance with the rules and regulations applicable thereon subject to satisfactory performance.

(i) The Stipend is payable only after verification of attendance and on the recommendation of the Head of the Department on the satisfactory progress of the scholar. (ii) Scholars who have already passed/appeared in MD/MS (Ay.) examination in any branch/speciality or appeared in MD/MS (Ay.) Part-II Examination will not be paid any Stipend. (iii) The scholars will not be allowed to practice or do any type of job outside the Institute during the duration of the PG Course. (iv) Every scholar, on admission, will have to execute a Bond on a Non-Judicial Stamp of Rs. 100/- undertaking to abide to study and complete the Course and if his admission is cancelled by the Institute before completion for any reason he/she will return the amount of Stipend received by him/her from the Institute.

3.6 Leave: The Following type of Leave facilities are available to the Post Graduate Scholars:

1. 10 days Casual Leave in an Academic Year.
2. 10 Days Term Leave on Deepawali festival.
3. 15 Days leave in an Academic Year on Medical ground duly supported by Medical Certificate.
4. 120 days Maternity leave to Female Scholars once during the study period, provided such leave was not utilized earlier in case of the In-Service Female Candidates.
5. On the recommendation of the Head of Department/Supervisor concerned, 30 days academic leave may be granted anytime during Part II Ind M.D.(Ayu.) the PG Course for conducting research work at other Institution/Places or for attending any Seminar/Workshop, where the candidate's paper is accepted. In such cases, candidates have to bear all the expenses. This leave shall be granted by the Director only on merit and cannot be claimed as a right. The candidate must submit the Certificate after attending the seminar.

Note: The leave facilities mentioned at 1, 2 & 3 above will not be carried forward to the next academic year and will lapse if not availed.

3.7 Educational Tour : Normally one Educational Tour is conducted for the Post-Graduate Scholars during first year for re-orientation and obtaining first hand knowledge and information on Medicinal Plants and also to know about allied Institutions and to exchange views on various aspects of Ayurveda.

3.8 Seminar and Extension Lectures: Departmental Seminars are regularly organized in the Post-Graduate Departments and eminent personalities in the field of Ayurveda are also invited to deliver extension lectures for exchange of views on research and developments in Ayurveda. The Post-Graduate scholars of II Part of M.D.(Ayu.) are required to participate in all such Seminars and Conferences organized by the Institute. They may also participate in Seminars/Workshops organized by other Institutions for which Sleeper Class Railway concession and academic leave shall only be allowed. However, Registration Fees may be allowed four times during the Part-II of M.D.(Ayu.) period for attending Seminar as per norms of the Institute and at the discretion of the Director.

3.9 Attendance: 66% attendance in Practical and Theory Classes is compulsory for appearing in the Examinations as per the Ordinances of the University.

4 Ragging: Ragging is an unlawful activity and is strictly prohibited. If found indulging in any type of ragging activity, strict disciplinary action including Police Case will be initiated against the scholar concerned. In case of any complaint against ragging of any kind, the scholars can

directly contact the Director, Dean and also the Committee formed for safeguarding against ragging either by phone or directly.
